The street becomes pedestrians only east of St-Laurent. There are lots of big terraces outside where you can eat and a lot of restaurants are BYOW (Bring your own wine) – there is a SAQ (Québec’s liquor store) on the corner of de Buillon street. Greek, Fondue, French, Mexican, Vietnamese, Portuguese, you name it, it’s there.
